GETCAP Mission Statement:

***GETCAP provides a variety of services that advance the self-sufficiency & general well-being of low-income East Texas households, through private & public partnerships***

GETCAP has approximately 170 full-time employees serving low income families in 31 counties with an approximate budget of \$16,145,000.

GETCAP has proudly expanded our service area to include Anderson, Henderson, Kaufman and Van Zandt for utility assistance. The Weatherization program has expanded to also include these counties as well as Harrison, Jasper, Newton, Panola, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Tyler, and Upshur. In 11 counties, **CSGB Case Management**, recently rebranded as **RISE**, served 87 individuals. 16 individuals transitioned out of poverty. CSBG supports numerous other programs, for example, Project SOS (Supply Our Schools), Project Turnaround (GED program) and Polk County Empty Stocking Assistance.

**Energy Assistance** served 20 counties and assisted 6520 households, spending a total of \$5,629,859.63. Energy Assistance provides assistance with paying energy bills, as well as provides assistance with A/C Unit repairs for the elderly and disabled.
